## LEASH DOGS ON WALKS



Did you know that a leash is commonly referred to as “Your Pet’s Lifeline,” protecting your pet from traffic and unrestrained animals? When walking your dog out in the public, or using amenities in Haslet such as parks or trails, be sure that the dog is under your control on a leash. Leashes protect both the dog and the dog owner from unexpected accidents. You may have your dog under control, but are you 100% confident that the person walking towards you with dogs off-leash has his or her dog under control? Leashing your dog is also a great good neighbor policy, preventing your dog from trespassing on the neighbor’s property during your walk and keeping your dog from jumping on people you encounter. This ensures that your dog has the chance of properly being introduced. Leashing is also a great identification tool, symbolizing that the dog has an owner, and enabling someone who sees the leash and identification tag attached to the dog’s collar to find you if you and your pet should become separated. Another benefit of leashing—it is less likely that your dog will be exposed to Parvo or Distemper as a leashed dog can be restrained from sniffing the droppings of other animals. Last but not least, leashing is required by city ordinance. By requiring all pets to be on leashes, we are doing our best to protect everyone and to keep our dogs safe.

## 2020 CENSUS

***Counting everyone once, only once, and in the right place.***

Census Day will be observed nationwide on April 1, 2020. The decennial census is the once-a-decade population and housing count of all 50 states and US Territories and is required by the US Constitution. The US Census Bureau is the largest federal government statistical agency and is dedicated to providing current facts and figures about America’s people, places and economy by conducting the census. Federal law protects the confidentiality of all individual responses the Census Bureau collects. The results of the census determine the number of seats for each state in the US House of Representatives and are used to draw congressional and state legislative districts. Federal agencies use the results to distribute more than \$675 billion in federal funds each year. The 2020 Census will implement new technology to make it easier to respond to the census and for the first time you will be able to respond online, by phone, as well as by mail. While participation in the census is voluntary, it is vitally important to help ensure an accurate and complete count of Haslet. More census info online at <https://www.2020census.gov/en>.

## FILING FOR PLACE ON MAY 2, 2020 GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT BEGINS JANUARY 15TH

The first day to file as a candidate on the May 2, 2020 General Election Ballot is January 15th. The last day to file is February 14th. The offices of Council Members Places 1, 3 and 5 will be on the ballot as well as the reauthorization of the local sales and use tax in the City of Haslet at the rate of one-quarter of one percent (0.25%) to continue providing revenue for maintenance and repair of municipal streets.
