WEST NILE VIRUS UPDATE

The 2015 Mosquito Surveillance season is in week 22 and has seen an average 78% increase in the number of female *Culex* species per trap over the same period last season. Week 22 (1st week in June) saw the largest increase, 90% more per trap than this time last season. This increase is attributed to the amount of rain received this season as compared to last season. This rain has left a lot of standing water, providing breeding grounds for mosquitoes.

All of our test results have been negative for WNV (West Nile Virus) and SLEV (Saint Louis Encephalitis). The North Texas Regional Laboratory at Tarrant County Public Health has tested 1,224 submitted mosquito pools this year. One pool in North Richland Hills has tested positive for WNV. To date in Tarrant County there has been one imported human case of CHIKV (Chikungunya Virus), one imported human case of DENV (Dengue Virus), no SLEV and no WNV.


The Public Works Department has applied 150 pounds of Bti (*Bacillus thurengensis israelensis*) larvicide this season, to prevent mosquito larvae from hatching. This is more larvicide than was applied all of last year, and we still have 6 months remaining in the current season. The Public Works Department Mosquito Surveillance trapping efforts will continue through at least the end of November. Efforts to drain standing water when practical or applying larvicide will continue as needed during the season. Use of chemical ground spraying is evaluated weekly based on test results received. Please dump any standing water on your property and use repellent. Also protect yourself by dressing for dusk and dawn with protective clothing when mosquitoes are most active.
