COUNCIL MOVING FORWARD TO FINE TUNE DETAILS OF HASLET PUBLIC INVESTMENT DISTRICT NUMBER 2

At the May 18, 2015, Regular City Council Meeting, Council approved creating Haslet Public Improvement District No. 2 (District) after being petitioned to do so by the property owner relating to the proposed The Heights development. The Heights development will be an approximate 154-acre residential development located on the south side of Blue Mound Road, east of FM 156. The developer, Lackland Holdings, LLC, seeks to develop the area for single-family residential purposes, with the intent of being reimbursed for a portion of the infrastructure costs through the District. The City and the developer have worked to prepare a Preliminary Service and Assessment Plan for the District, which identifies the nature of the improvements to be constructed and estimates the project improvement costs. A proposed Assessment Roll has also been prepared which identifies the parcels to be assessed (only those located in The Heights development) and apportions the total costs of the improvements to be assessed in the District. City Council will hold a Public Hearing on August 3, 2015 at 7 p.m. to receive input regarding the Preliminary Service and Assessment Plan and proposed Assessment Rolls for The Heights development to be located in Haslet PID No. 2.

The Haslet Economic Development Corporations recently approved updating the City's economic development website. The resulting enhanced website is now up and running at

BenefitsCheckUp is a free service of the National Council on Aging (NCOA), a nonprofit service and advocacy organization in Washington, DC. Many adults over 55 need help paying for prescription drugs, health care, utilities, and other basic needs. There are over 2,000 federal, state and private benefits programs available to help but many people don't know these programs exist or how they can apply. BenefitsCheckUp asks a series of questions to help identify benefits that could save you money and cover the costs of everyday expenses. After answering the questions, you will get a report created just for you that describes the assistance programs you may be eligible for. You can apply for many of the programs online or you can print an application form. Some of the types of expenses that may qualify for assistance are: medications, food, utilities, legal, health care, housing, in-home services, taxes, transportation, and employment training.
