FIRST COMPREHENSIVE PLAN PUBLIC INPUT MEETING HELD

On December 2, 2015, the first Comprehensive Plan Public Input Meeting was held at the Haslet Community Center. Members of the professional planning firm, LandDesign, were present to report on their analysis to date regarding the major issues that need to be addressed in the new comprehensive plan. A Comprehensive Plan is best described as a guide to the City's future. The Comprehensive Plan informs current and future decision makers where we are now, where we want to go, how we intend to get there, and who will help us along the way. Some primary objectives for the plan include getting our community on the same page about Haslet's future and defining Haslet's legacy.



There was a great turnout of Haslet residents to participate in this important part of gathering input for the plan. Different stations were set up for those in attendance to examine several maps including the Future Land Use Map, ask questions, and write suggestions and comments. This input will be compiled and considered in development of the final proposed comprehensive plan. Another Public Input Meeting will be held after the first of the new year, and the details will be announced soon. LONG-AWAITED RUNWAY EXTENSION PROJECT UNDERWAY AT ALLIANCE AIRPORT

Alliance Air/Aviation Services President Tom Harris was the featured speaker at the recent 35W Coalition quarterly meeting. Harris detailed the status of the long-awaited, multi-year effort to extend runways 16R/34L, 16L/34R and Taxiway A to 11,000 feet at the north end of Fort Worth Alliance Airport.

The expansion, once completed in the first quarter of 2018, will allow greater flight capability and enable long-haul flights to take off fully fueled under almost any weather conditions, increasing air cargo capacity out of Alliance Airport and boosting business in Fort Worth and the region.

"This is an exciting milestone for Alliance Airport," Harris said. "This extension brings us closer to realizing our master plan of transforming the role of this airport regionally, nationally and internationally."

Harris also pointed out that moving the project forward was a collective effort by multiple agencies. Since the inception of the runway extension program, the airport has received funding from the FAA, the Texas Department of Transportation and other local sources.

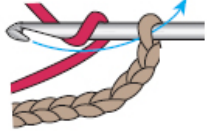
The first phase of this extension involves extensive site work to bring areas around the runway up to airport grade. This includes the former section of FM 156 as well as BNSF Railways previous rail line north of the runway.

The Haslet Fire Department held its annual canned food drive with the final items picked up by the fire engine from Haslet curbsides on Saturday, December 5th. This year the Haslet Public Library also participated in the canned food drive by accepting canned goods as payment for library late fees. One can for \$1, up to \$15 could be waived from fees owed. The library collected 269 cans that were included in the goods donated.
