At the Regular City Council meeting held on May 20, 2019, outgoing Council Member Place 2 Mitch Hill was presented a plaque for appreciation of his service and dedication as a council member. Mr. Hill decided not to run for re-election after serving over eight years on Council. His contributions have been many and he will be missed.

At the same meeting, Mayor Bob Golden, Council Member Place 4 Patricia Hilborn and new Council Member Place 2 Harold Williams were administered the Oath of Office resulting from the May election, for the two-year term of 2019-2021. Mayor Golden was first elected Mayor in 2009. Council Member Hilborn was first elected in 2017. Both Mayor Golden and Council Member Hilborn have attained the Certified Municipal Official (CMO) designation

from the Texas Municipal League which requires meeting annual continuing education benchmarks for renewal. Council Member Williams returns to City Council after taking a "break" and is starting his sixth term.

At the Regular City Council meeting held on June 3, 2019, City Council accepted the resignation of long-time Council Member Place 3 Kathy Hopper, who resigned due to relocating outside of Haslet. Ms. Hopper was first elected to council in 2010 and also served as Mayor Pro Tem. She was dedicated to her role on council to serve Haslet's citizens and to make Haslet a great place to live. City Council will consider making an appointment to fill the vacant Place 3 for the remainder of the unexpired term through May 2020. Just a reminder that the City of Haslet does not allow the discharge, use, sale, ignition, manufacture or storage of fireworks which includes firecrackers, cannon crackers, sky rockets, torpedoes, roman candles, sparklers, squibs, fire balloons, or any other substance intended for a visible or audible pyrotechnic display. Any fireworks found will be confiscated without compensation. Violation is also punishable by fine (City of Haslet Ordinance 0705-03). More info is available at www.Haslet.org.

HOME SWIMMING POOL SAFETY

Summertime is time for staying in the pool in Texas and along with the sunscreen, be sure to take steps to keep your family safe around the water. According to the American Red Cross, 69% of young children who drown were not expected to be in or near water—learn how to reduce the risks. Here is the American Red Cross's list of the TOP THINGS TO KNOW:

- ▶ Secure your pool with appropriate barriers. ▶ If a child is missing, check the water first.
- ▶ Designate a water watcher...and stay in arm's reach of young children.
- ▶ Install anti-entrapment drain covers and safety release systems to protect against drain entrapment.
